Type of Foundation: usually independent, Corporate or Public (most community foundations are public foundations.)

The symbol "①" appears if additional biographical or background notes exist on the CD-ROM DataBook software package (data does not appear in the DataBook.)

Fiscal Information from IRS 990 tax forms. Management & General includes all the expenses of the foundation. Fund Balance from 990 page one.

The symbol "☑" appears if the foundation has checked the box (990, pg. 9) indicating "the organization only makes contributions to preselected organizations and does not accept unsolicited requests for funds."

The 990s provide minimal information, which is supplemented here when the foundations have provided additional detail. "Trustees" includes "Officers, Directors & Trustees" as listed in the 990 (some are corrected or modified by the Foundation.)

Overview information is calculated from the individual grants. Total number of grants, total amount, etc. and the bar charts are calculated results. Bar charts show money, not number of grants. Grantee Category chart shows total grant dollars by category; Geographic chart shows the same money geographically.

Subtotals by category: "Pct (%) of total" represents grant dollars paid, not number of grants; average grant size is provided within each category, as well as overall average size above.

Note that some foundations make grant awards payable over several years or occasionally make an award which is payable in future years. What is shown in the DataBook is the amount actually paid during the year. Few foundations make these types of awards and many publish annual reports or web pages which provide additional detail. Grant seekers researching potential support should review annual reports or websites if they are available and check for the establishment of new websites as well.

Every grant made by the foundation for the most recent year available is listed. The "✱" symbol indicates a "capital" grant. The symbol "•" appears when the grantee name exactly matches a grantee supported by the foundation in either of the last two editions of the DataBook. This could reflect a multi-year grant of a foundation for a project spanning several years, e.g., a capital campaign or start-up project, or just ongoing support for a particular organization. Amounts shown in Overview (total number of grants, total amount, average, largest, smallest and funded prior edition) are calculated from the grants listings. Total grant amount may or may not match Program Service amount shown at the top of the listing.

National Taxonomy of Exempt Entities (NTEE) major classification codes are the basis for classification of grant recipients. It is the grantee organization which is classified, not the "purpose" of the grant. Thus a grant for the football field at a school would be classified as "Education" rather than "Recreation, leisure, sports, athletics." Similarly, museums appear as "Arts, culture, humanities"—including a Museum of Science & Industry. If an organization is multipurpose, e.g., it provides shelter, mental health and health services and job placement, it would be classified as "Human services." (See Taxonomy page.)

Grants are listed alphabetically within categories. Categories are listed alphabetically for the grants listings, but the bar chart showing grants by categories presents the six largest categories of grants paid in descending order, followed by an amount which represents the aggregate of the remaining grants.
