Published Info: Grant Consideration Application (see website).

Other Info: Our Application process has three steps. 1. First, go to 'Download Forms' on our website and fill in all requested information on our Grant Consideration Application. Once completed, print and submit as instructed. Your information will be included in a first round review by our Executive Committee. 2. If there is further interest, you will be invited to complete a Grant Application Form. Your application will then be included in the second round and reviewed by all board members. 3. The final grant decisions are made at the next scheduled board meeting by our full board. We respect your time and effort in preparing your application and will keep you apprised of your standing in a timely manner. For Oregon: small grants (\$1,000 to \$25,000; Large grants: \$26,000 to \$75,000.

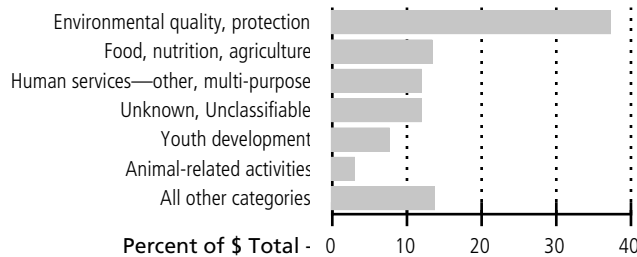

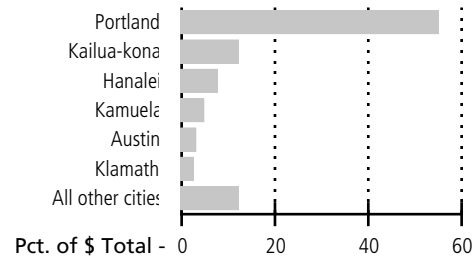
