IMPORTANT INFORMATION-
Everything you need to find a "good fit" between your organization's needs and a funding source's funding priorities. Foundations which "give to preselected charities and generally do not accept unsolicited proposals" are indicated prominently with a special symbol: "c" next to Restrictions.

OVERVIEW INFORMATION-
Calculated from grants listings; totals sometimes different than "Program service" above (See "Fiscal information.") E/G Ratio shows expenses as a percentage of grants (program service) amount.

GRANTS BY CATEGORY-
Grant listings are organized by category, with average grant size per category and subtotals by percent and dollars within categories.

FUNDED PRIOR EDITION-
Bullets next to grantee listings show grantees which received a grant from the profiled foundation in prior editions of the DataBook.

CAPITAL GRANT-
Capital grants are indicated with a (✳) symbol and there is an index of the foundations which made capital grants in the rear of the DataBook.

EVERY GRANT -
All the grants are listed for each foundation. Sure it was a lot more work, but it makes for a lot more valuable fundraising reference tool. Don't you agree?

Purpose: The Assisi Foundation responds to the diverse needs of our community to support health, lifelong learning, social justice, and responsible use of resources with respect and compassion for all. The Foundation's areas of interests include Healthcare and Human Services, Education and Literacy, Social Justice/Ethics, Cultural Enrichment and the Arts. Preference is given to proposals that: Address a critical community need or opportunity; Address root causes of a problem; Include clearly stated goals, time-lines, objectives, and measurable outcomes; Include an effective mechanism for measuring the impact of program/project and funding received; Exhibit sound and realistic financial plans as well as a diversification of funding sources; Will not duplicate existing services unless there is a clear need for additional services; Can be replicated by other organizations; Involve collaboration and cooperation with other organizations or agencies; Promote activities that build and sustain connections among diverse groups.

Restrictions: Grants are made only to qualified 501 (C) (3) organizations. No grants are made to or for: Individuals; National fundraising drives; Projects that address the needs of only one congregation; Tickets for benefits; Political organizations or candidates for public office; Lobbying activities; Recurring budget deficits; Tournament fees and/or travel for athletic competitions. Ordinarily, grants are not made for: Program expenses that occur on a regular basis (i.e. annual workshop series, membership dues, regularly needed medical equipment or patient care); Regularly supported activities of fundraising organizations; Replacement of government funding cuts. Perpetual ongoing support for programs will not be provided.

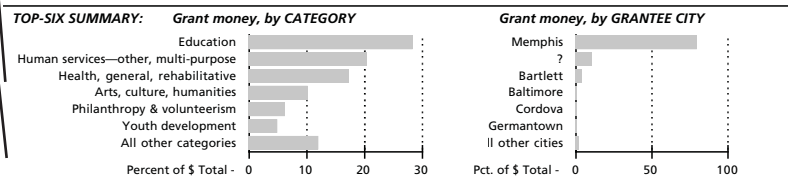

A mouse icon (M) indicates biographical, financial or other information about the foundation is available on the CD (data that is not shown in the printed DataBook).

FISCAL INFORMATION-
Includes information from the latest 990 tax returns of each foundation: Total revenue; Program service (grants); Management & general (all expenses); and Fund balance (market value).

UNIQUE GRAPHIC PRESENTATION-
Charts show top categories for the grant money awarded by each foundation. After showing the top six categories (by percentage of dollars awarded), the display lumps all other grants together as "All other categories." Unique geographic charting of grant money by city gives a useful and clear picture of where the money goes.
