OVERVIEW INFORMATION-
Calculated from grants listings; totals sometimes different than "Program service" above (See "Fiscal information.") E/G Ratio shows expenses as a percentage of grants (program service) amount.

GRANTS BY CATEGORY-
Grant listings are organized by category, with average grant size per category and subtotals by percent and dollars within categories.

FUNDED PRIOR EDITION-
Bullets next to grantee listings show grantees which received a grant from the profiled foundation in prior editions of the DataBook.

CAPITAL GRANT-
Capital grants are indicated with a (☞) symbol and there is an index of the foundations which made capital grants in the rear of the DataBook.

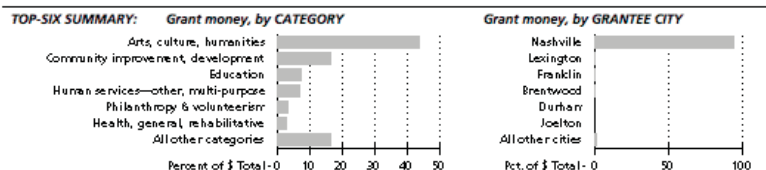
EVERY GRANT -

Purpose: The Foundation is especially focused on grants to enhance the infrastructure of non-profit organizations serving the greater Nashville area. These include investments in capital, technology, training and various types of management assistance. Major programs include capacity-building grants; technology grants; funding to assist organizations serving inner-city residents who have settled in Nashville; grants aimed at improving the Nashville public schools; and grants to address challenges linked to growth in the Middle Tennessee region.
Restrictions: For legal reasons, the Foundation does not support individuals or their projects, private foundations, political activities, advertising or sponsorships. As a matter of policy, the Foundation does not ordinarily support: recurring expenses for operations, programs or salaries, except as described earlier; projects, programs or organizations that serve a limited audience or a relatively small number of people; endowments or scholarship; social or fundraising events; biomedical or clinical research; schools below the college level, except for projects intended to serve the broader community; hospitals or nursing homes; organizations whose principal impact is outside of Middle Tennessee; religious organizations for religious purposes.

Geographic Focus: The Greater Nashville area.
Deadlines: Proposals are accepted throughout the year.
Publication: Organizations should make contact by phone, by letter of inquiry or by completing an application through the website. If you apply by mail, the letter should describe, in no more than two pages, the organization and its record of accomplishment, the objectives of the grant, the amount sought from the Foundation in relation to the total need, exactly how the Foundation funds would be used, and the proposed method to evaluate the program's success. Only one copy is needed. Applicants may either complete an application online or download an application to submit via regular post. Downloadable applications are available as either an Adobe .pdf or Microsoft Word document.

FISCAL INFORMATION-
Includes information from the latest 990 tax returns of each foundation: Total revenue; Program service (grants); Management & general (all expenses); and Fund balance (market value).

UNIQUE GRAPHIC PRESENTATION-
Charts show top categories for the grant money awarded by each foundation. After showing the top six categories (by percentage of dollars awarded), the display lumps all other grants together as "All other categories." Unique geographic charting of grant money by city gives a useful and clear picture of where the money goes.
